Dear Saints of First Presbyterian,

This whole situation reminds me of an old joke. A dog sees his master going to work, coming home from work, and his reaction is always, "Woof! There he goes! Woof! Woof! Here he comes." The cat meanwhile is keeping a diary: "Day 735 of my captivity. The captor again gave me a can of tasteless mush to eat. The stupid dog wags his tail at the activities of the captors, but I continue to plot my escape."

It begins to feel like captivity, doesn't it? Well, the Session has news! As you may have surmised, the Worship committee and a few others spent last month polling you. The results were that slightly more than half of you would come back to worship, if proper steps were taken to keep us all safe. The others want to wait a bit, and some of them are willing to wait until a cure is found to this virus! We are all in different places in this.

The Session determined that we would first wait a couple of weeks, just to be sure that this reopening doesn't lead to a change in the number of active virus cases. If that is not the case, we will have an outdoor worship service on June 21st and the Sundays thereafter. Outdoors means we will use the property where the Deal House once was, where Elliott Lewis created the prayer garden last year, as a location. You can come and sit in that lot, or park in the parking lot and listen from your car. We will enforce social distancing, and you must have a mask if you get out of your car. But we will be together, you can see each other, "blow a kiss if you want to" someone on Session said. Details of things like sound systems and things are being worked out.

So, the details: **worship on Sunday, June 21, outdoors, at 9:30 AM.** Sit in chairs, or park in the lot. If you come to sit, park away from the grass field, please. If it rains, we will start it the following week. Yes, we are starting pretty early, but that is to try and beat the heat.

Note: our taped video service will continue. So you will have choices. The sermon will be the same.

Your crusty old pastor is slowly losing his objections to some sort of "virtual communion." We will announce the how and when later, but expect us to do that in a few weeks as well. It won't be quite like the real in person sacrament, but it will be something to keep us together in the meantime. We will not, however, sanction the use of Diet Pepsi and Ritz crackers for the elements!

I know that some of you wish we had taken these steps weeks ago. Your Session is being careful and cautious, and your safety is the most important consideration for them. There is simply too much we don't know. Other Presbyterians in the area are also taking a very slow approach to reopening the church building for worship.

### Missions Update May, 2020

As in many other areas of our lives, the arrival of the Corona virus and its associated disease, COVID-19, has greatly impacted the plans of the Missions Commit-

tee here at FPC-Newton. Some events have been cancelled and others postponed, but with God's help and with support of the loving and generous members of our congregation, we will carry on!

For the past three years, one of the highlights of the spring has been a church-wide effort to assist in ending world hunger. Working with an organization known as Rise Against Hunger, we have packaged nearly 40,000 meals which have been shipped to various areas in need of food support, including countries in South America and Africa. This year's event was to have been held on March 28th and we would have included our friends from Beth Eden Lutheran. That effort will be held in the fall, with a tentative date of Saturday, September 12th.

In 2018, a team of fifteen members traveled to Guatemala and had an opportunity to visit with members of our sister church, El Redentor. It was with much anticipation that we organized another trip which would have traveled in late July. Several team meetings were held, airline tickets were secured and then the virus changed these plans as well. To the best of our knowledge, our partners have not had any positive cases of COVID-19 but most are out of work and are facing impending food shortages and other financial difficulties. The Presbytery of Western North Carolina has organized an effort to assist our brothers and sisters in the country. Our committee has sent \$3,000 from our Missions budget as well as making a \$1,000 donation to the Guatemala Microloan Project. This is a joint project of Presbyterian Women from Suchitepequez and Sur Occidente Presbyteries, and the Presbytery of Western North Carolina. The goal is for the women of the three presbyteries to work together to provide Guatemalan women opportunities to grow in self-esteem, hope, freedom and to help them develop sources of economic income for themselves and their families. Mimi Michael has been very involved since the inception of this project and can provide more information on ways that we can assist. We have also had a long relationship with a Presbyterian school and hospital in the African country of Malawi. Through the generosity of your pledges, we have also donated \$1,000 to the Eberneezer School and the Nkhoma Hospital. The PWNC would welcome private donations to address these urgent needs and instructions for donating are found elsewhere in this newsletter.

There are other important matters that have been impacted by the pandemic. The "One Great Hour of Sharing" offering is collected on Easter Sunday and another PC-USA Special Offering is collected on Pentecost Sunday which falls on May 31st this year. Please consider whether you are able to support these efforts. Please be in prayer for all of our Mission Co-workers as they deal with the pandemic in their locales. Please remember those in our community who lack adequate food and housing. Pray for the assistance ministries such as The Corner Table, ECCCM, and Habitat for Humanity as they do their good work in these difficult times.

We look forward to the time that we can physically worship together... until then we will continue to do God's good work, both here and around the world. The best item I have seen on social media is this..."We are not all in the same boat, but we are all in the same storm!"


## Music Ministry Notes

There will be no Coordinating Team meeting in June or July.




