Dear Saints of First Church,

It almost feels as though the pandemic is a thing of the past, at least in our area. The churches are back, for the most part, and are open and active. We are worshiping more like we used to do, with more changes coming in the next few weeks. People who are vaccinated are feeling like they are safe, and we are glad to be able to be back.

Now, we come to a question: how has the pandemic changed the church? What will be different in the future? One thing is that we learned we can do this. We can survive a lockdown with no ill effects. We know we will survive. A second thing we learned is how to do online worship much better than in the past. We have our services live-streamed each week, which means you can be with us even if you are on vacation, or not feeling well. Some folks worship in person at 8:45 but tune in at 11:00 to see what the other sermon will say. A third thing we have learned is that we don't want to take physical gathering for granted. We continue to give thanks for the various ways we get together, and to enjoy one another's company. And perhaps a fourth thing is, we renew our commitment to mission.

The Presbyterian Church has the Matthew 25 Initiative that I mentioned in a sermon a few weeks ago. It consists of three broad areas: Revitalizing Congregational Ministry, Dismantling Structural Racism, and Eradicating Systemic Poverty. I believe one way to revitalize and rejuvenate the congregation's life is a continued commitment to mission. The other two initiatives fit into that quite well. They are hard ones. It is one thing to welcome and be kind to people of other races; it is another to remove structures that encourage racism. It is one thing to feed people; it is another to eradicate poverty that is systemic and continuing.

Let me ask you to think about these things. How can we do them? In our own lives and in our congregation's life, what would they look like? Perhaps you will think of a new idea, a new form of ministry that we could embrace which will make a difference in the lives of people and of the community. If you have a new idea, let me hear from you!

One thing that is under consideration is bringing back some form of mid-week educational and fellowship program for our young people and the people in the neighborhood. It won't look exactly like LOGOS did, but it will be similar. Again, if you have ideas about this program, let us hear from you.

I remember learning that in one town some church people were going to an apartment complex once a week, and sitting in a picnic shelter reading to the children. The children in turn were asking questions and learning to read better. It was easy, and it went on for several years. Something like that is pretty easy, if we have the motivation to get started.

We are back, and I am glad. We'd love to see you come back, find your favorite pew, and join us on Sundays! Will you do that?

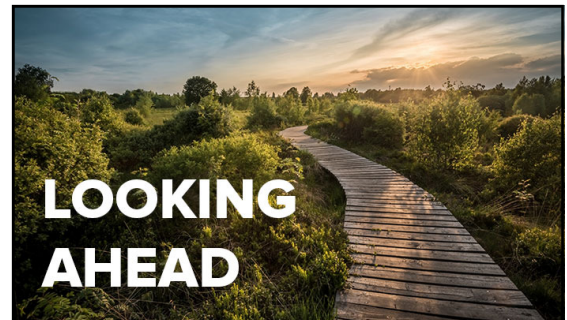
Nursery is provided during the 11:00 a.m. worship service. B.L.A.S.T. will begin on Sunday, June 6th.

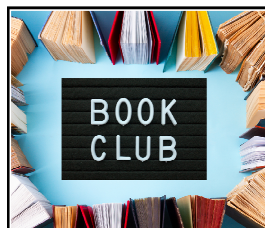

Parade of Cans Food Drive

August 1 - 31, 2021

The Parade of Cans is an annual August event held in conjunction with the Old Soldiers' Reunion Week. During the month of August, our church will be collecting canned goods which will be donated to The Corner Table and the Backpack Program. Collection bins will be located in the Narthex throughout the month of August. Below is a list of foods that are most needed by The Corner Table and the Backpack Program.

Foods Most Needed by The Corner Table: Canned Potatoes (sliced, diced or whole), Sauerkraut, Carrots (sliced), Lima Beans, Crushed Tomatoes, Greens (turnip or collard), Sweet Peas, Rotel Green Chilis & Tomatoes, Mayonnaise, Mustard, Ketchup, Vienna Sausages or Potted Meat, Pasta (egg noodles, rotini, penne, elbow), Stove Top Stuffing, Dry Beans (great northern, black eyed peas), Mayonnaise packets, Mustard packets, Ketchup packets, Pickles (dill spears, dill chips, dill cubes, sweet cubes), BBQ sauce, Evaporated Milk, Biscuit Flour, Self-Rising Flour, Cream of Mushroom or Cream of Chicken Soup, Chicken Broth, Cornmeal, Pork n Beans, Grits (Bulk), Sugar

Foods Most Needed by the Backpack Program: Macaroni & Cheese (boxed or Easy Mac), Microwave Meals (unrefrigerated), Pop Top Canned Meals (such as Chef Boyardee), Canned Meat (tuna or chicken), Peanut Butter (plastic containers only), Jelly (plastic containers only), Canned Pasta, Rice (1 lb. bags or less), Cereal (Small boxes), Pop tarts, Kid friendly snacks (granola bars, fruit snacks, goldfish, popcorn, etc.)

You may donate money instead of food. Every dollar donated is equivalent to two (2) pounds. If you choose to donate money, we ask that you specify how to apply your donation. Make all checks payable to First Presbyterian Church, and specify on the memo line where your contribution should go (The Corner Table, Backpack Program, or both).

Partnership Relief Program

Our congregation, working with other churches in the Presbytery of Western North Carolina, has a long and strong relationship with our brothers and sisters in Christ in developing countries. For the last 25 years we have been involved in a partnership with El Redentor Presbyterian Church, located in the small coastal community of Los Cerritos. They are a member church of Sur Occidente Presbytery and 33 other PWNC churches have partnered with churches in that presbytery as well as others in the presbytery of Suchitepequez. The essence of the partnership program is evident in its logo..."Juntos en Cristo/Together in Christ."

Around 15 years ago, the PWNC formed a relationship with Dr. Barbara Nagy, a Pediatrician from North Carolina who was serving in the African country of Malawi. Dr. Nagy was working at the Nkhoma Hospital and over the years, our presbytery has supported their work and helped to start the Ebenezer School which now has over 400 students in pre-kindergarten through middle school. The hospital has set up nine rural health clinics and operates a mobile health unit. Each year, pre-pandemic, mission teams have visited both of these countries, working hand in hand and side by side with our brothers and sisters.

As it has in every corner of the world, the pandemic caused by the Coronavirus has greatly impacted the citizens of Guatemala and Malawi. Shutdowns have led to lost employment and food insecurity. Congregations have been unable to support their pastors. A delay in providing adequate vaccines has worsened the conditions. As of July 9, the level of new cases of Covid infection was at an all time high in Guatemala and only 3% of the population had been vaccinated. The situation is similar in Malawi.

As a response, the Partnership Committee of the PWNC has formulated a plan of support that will send funds to Guatemala and Malawi. The Missions Committee of our church has decided to send \$3,000 from our budget to support the relief program. A portion of those funds will benefit El Redentor directly and the remainder will be used for the general relief fund. If individual members of the congregation would like to contribute, checks may be sent to the church with "Partnership Relief Program" in the memo line. Camp Grier Annual Church Retreat Old Fort, NC - September 17-19th

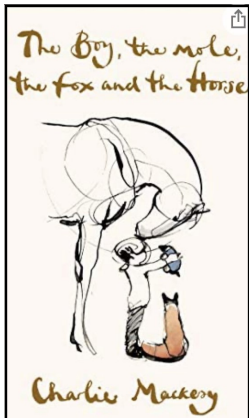
